The indigenous aspect of the Flag of Unity are reminiscent of parts of the famed Harold Thomas flag. Yet in its form hopefully acceptable to the second Australians as an overall national symbol. This without losing its meaning and importance to the Koori race of our first peoples. All main symbols are part of the importance and power of indigenous spiritual law.

The Kangaroo

The Big Red is not only totemic it is also a symbol of strength and a positive stance and the determination to leap to great heights. Its red ochre also a reminder of the land.

The Southern Cross

Of spiritual prominence and guidance the cross is also the reminder that the Australian indigenous peoples were the first to recognise astronomy in the philosophy of the stars and where the spirituality is so strong.

The white aura surrounding the roo and the white of light stars centre is a reminder that we are all of one basic design though also of many eternally.

The Sun

As a circle it stands for eternity and unity. It is also symbolic of growth of the indigenous nation being in the form and colour of our national flower.

Black

As a reminder of the keepers of our lands through thousands of years of a race warriors of the environment. Remembrance.

Colours Black Red and Gold

All the colours of the two NAIDOC flag are prominent. It also has the colour characteristics of the first indigenous flag "Corroboree" of 1962, unique in its circles of eternity and black outlined map.
